



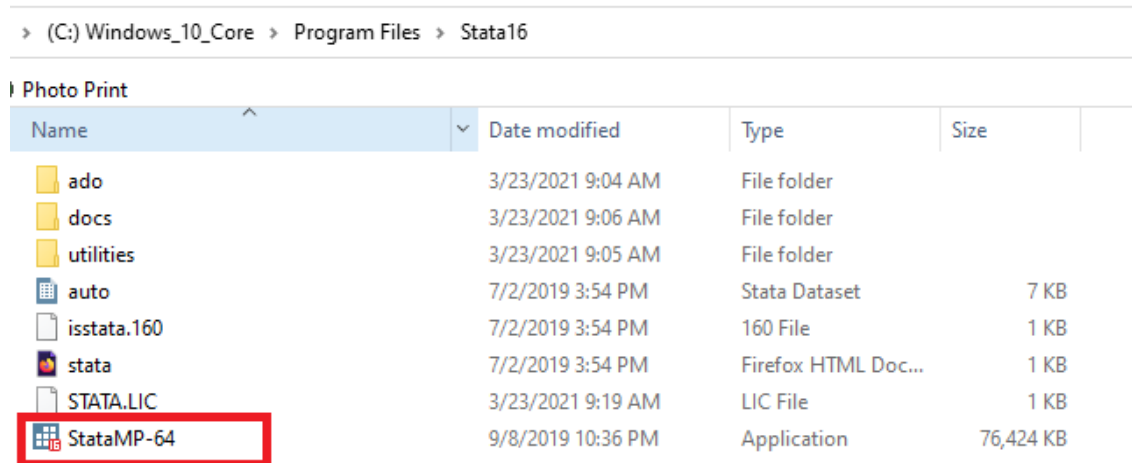

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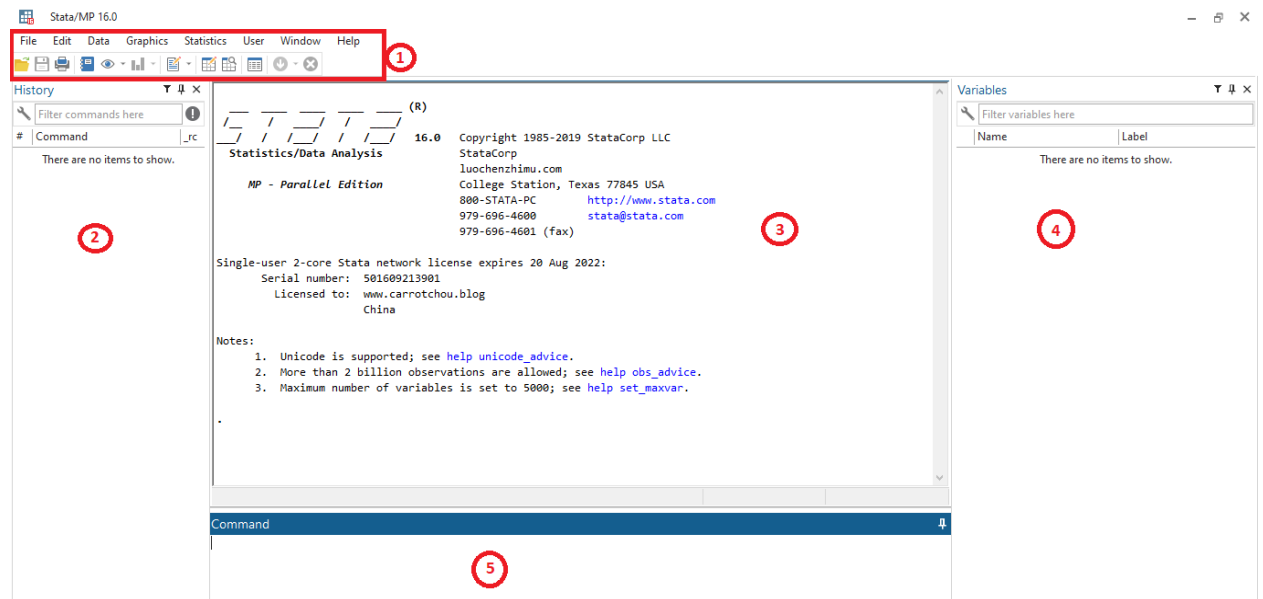
## Lesson-1: Window overview

- **Opening Stata:** Go to your Stata installed directory “C:\Program Files\Stata16” and click on “StataMP-64”.



You can right click on “StataMP-64” and send to Desktop shortcut so that it will be more easier to open all time.

## Lesson-2: Command

- Working directory: pwd

```
. pwd
C:\Users\Julhas\Documents
.
```

- To change the working directory to avoid typing the whole path when calling or saving files, type: cd E:\Stata

```
. cd E:\Stata
E:\Stata
.
Command
```
